MOVING INDIGENOUS STATISTICS AND SURVEY RESEARCH WITH INDIGENOUS PEOPLE

When thinking about the limitations of the institutional and national datasets using Indigenous populations, researchers need to consider that most research designs do not adequately address methodological issues associated with small and unrepresentative samples of Natives. To truly understand the limitations of data in Indigenous communities and more justly represent them requires engaging Indigenous communities to address the complexities of Indigenous data. Exploring and evaluating current research that uses data with Indigenous communities, we'll discuss how to create measures within the context of specific tribal communities that privileges community notions of being and knowing.
